REGISTRATION RULES

A non-refundable deposit of \$200.00 is required for each camp session to secure your spot, or you may pay in full at the time you register. Otherwise the balance is due on the first day of camp.

In the event of illness or emergency and the camper is unable to attend, we will refund your enrollment less your \$200.00 deposit if you have paid in full, or offer you riding lessons for your camper equal to the amount of the registration.

If you have registered for camp and wish to switch to another session, we will switch you to another session if a spot is available. If a spot is not available, you can apply your deposit payment to riding lessons.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT SUMMER HORSE CAMP

HOURS

Camp hours are 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday.

If you have a day when you are running late or your camper will not be coming, please call and let us know so we can plan our activities accordingly.

PICK UP

We request written authorization if someone other than a parent or guardian is picking up a camper. We will provide you with a form for this purpose on the first day of camp, but please let us know.

Note: Camp ends at 4:00 each day. Please be prepared to pick up your camper on time. We have other responsibilities and cannot supervise your child unless special arrangements are made with us in advance. After hours child care can be arranged for \$10.00 per hour.

FIRST DAY OF CAMP YOU SHOULD BRING:

- 1. Camp documents including medical release and liability release forms.
- 2. Camp balance if not previously paid in full.
- 3. Lunch for the day, a snack, and a large water bottle.
- 4. Sunscreen.
- 5. Shorts and shoes, (not sandals), to change into for afternoon activities.
- 6. Horse treats: Carrots and apples, or "store bought" horse treats.

ATTIRE:

- 1. Students must have their own approved riding helmet. (Not a bike helmet.)
- 2. Long pants (not capris).
- 3. A low-heeled boot (not Western boots). English Paddock boots can be purchased at a reasonable rate from Dover Saddlery in North Dallas, or over the Internet.



HORSE CAMP FACILITY RULES

- 1. A liability release is required for all riders before getting on a horse.
- 2. No riding without the permission and presence of a camp counsellor or the manager.
- 3. No jumping is allowed unless the rider is in a lesson and/or under the supervision of an instructor.
- 4. All riders must wear a helmet when mounted.
- 5. Campers must wear long pants and boots when riding.
- 6. No running, yelling, or rough –housing in the barn and around horses.
- 7. No throwing balls or other objects around horses.
- 8. To avoid the risk of being kicked, do not run up to or behind a horse.
- 9. Do not feed any horse without the owner's consent. Feed treats from a bucket and not by hand and only with permission.
- 10. Absolutely no running after, chasing, or hitting any horse or other animal.
- 11. No children other than campers are allowed in the barn unless accompanied by an adult. If the barn is crowded, please do not enter.
- 12. All guests in the barn must have proper footwear, meaning close-toed shoes.
- 13. Never walk away from a horse that is not tied up. Always attend to your horse.
- 14. Keep all gates to horse and livestock areas closed.
- 15. Riders should not mount a horse unless an instructor is present.
- 16. Campers are responsible for putting away all supplies and equipment after use, including saddles, bridles, brushes and other supplies.
- 17. Campers are responsible for learning to clean up after their horse. You know what that means!
- 18. Please pick up and dispose of all trash.
- 19. Campers are responsible for cleaning up the area after projects.
- 20. Campers are responsible for cleaning up the camp area after meals and snacks.
- 21. Camps will treat other campers with courtesy and respect.
- 22. Campers will behave in a respectful manner towards camp counsellors and will follow their instructions at all times.
- 23. Campers will not go into fenced in livestock areas without permission.
- 24. Campers will take care of their horses first after riding.
- 25. Campers are responsible for keeping track of their own belongings at all times.
- 26. No glass containers on the property, please.
- 27. Please turn off lights in the rest rooms.
